

AWARNING

Do not stand or walk on the top of any cabinet. 38" (973 mm) cabinets with work surface tops have a maximum load capacity of 250 lb (113 kg) for evenly distributed loads.

All other cabinets have a top maximum load capacity of 50 lb (23 kg).

NOTICE

To save assembly time, it is recommended to have more than one of each type of screwdriver on hand.

Wall Fasteners - Not Supplied

Because materials and construction of walls can vary, fasteners for attaching the cabinets to the structure are not provided.

The installer must choose the appropriate fastener and follow the manufacturer's instructions.

AWARNING

Inferior or improperly installed fasteners could cause the cabinets to tip over.

Determine the construction of the walls.

If cabinets are attached to the wall and adjacent cabinets:

no attachment to the floor is required for standard installation.

For seismic, peninsula or island configurations, cabinets would be attached to the floor.

See the "Secure Cabinets" procedures for more information.


Cabinet Fastener Guidelines:

- If the wall is wood stud-and-drywall construction, attachment should be by lag screws (1/4" minimum)
- If the wall is metal stud-and-drywall construction, attachment should be by toggle bolt (1/4" minimum)
- If the wall is concrete block construction, attachment should be by concrete screw (Tapcon) or toggle bolt (1/4" minimum)
- If the wall is poured concrete construction, attachment should be by concrete screw (Tapcon) or wedge-type concrete anchors

NOTICE

Each wall connection must be rated for a minimum of 500 lb (227 kg) of tension. Other fasteners may be used if the connection strength requirement is met.

Before Installation

Overview

- Assembly and installation should be performed by skilled technical persons, and only after carefully studying these instructions.
- It is suggested that the cabinets are setup in a space that is large enough to safely handle the cartons, pieces, finished cabinets, and dunnage.
- Inspect the condition of the wall and floor where the cabinets will be located. If the wall is not straight, establish a reference line so that the fronts of all cabinets will line up. Also, determine the highest point on the floor, which will establish the leveled height of each row of cabinets.
- Build only one cabinet at a time, to avoid intermixing parts. Build each according to these instructions for the specific model.
 - Do not start installing doors until all cabinets are assembled and in their final location, leveled and secured to adjacent walls and cabinets.
- After all cabinets are in place, distribute the door cartons and door hardware sets to each cabinet.
 Assemble and hang the doors one at a time according to the instructions.
 Then clean off any fingerprints, dirt, and dust, using a clean rag and mild spray cleaner or acetone.

Before You Begin

Keep the Packing List with the cabinet, for reference until the unit is completely assembled.


- Read the complete assembly procedure before beginning the assembly.
- The cabinet carton is marked with the cabinet number as shown in "Cabinet Identification".
- Hardware packs may contain extra fasteners that are not required on all cabinets.
- Because of the variety of possible wall surfaces, wall fasteners are not included.
 Have your maintenance personnel recommend an appropriate type for safe, secure attachment and have the fasteners available before assembling the cabinet.
- At least two people (preferably four) are required to assemble the cabinet and set it upright.

Installation Procedures

- Identify which cabinet is being assembled.
 Refer to "Cabinet Identification", the cabinet carton and any installation drawings.
- 2. Assemble the cabinet according to "Assembly" on pages 12-24.
- 3. Level the cabinet according to "Level Cabinets" on pages 25-26.
- 4. If the cabinet has doors, attach them according to "Attach Doors" on pages 27-37.
- 5. If the cabinet is an AcoustiCabinet, attach the backing material according to "Attach Backing" on page 38.
- Secure cabinets to the structure walls or secure them together according to "Secure Cabinets" on pages 39-46.
- 7. Install optional cover panels to the exposed cabinet ends according to "Finished Back Kit" and "Cover Panel Installation" on pages 47-49.
- 8. Install top closure panels to close empty spaces behind cabinets according to "Closure Panel Installation" on page 50.
- 9. For Cabinets 50-62, attach work surface tops according to "Work Surface Tops" on page 55.

Assembly - Group 1 (continued)

Pre-Assembly

NOTICE

For panel orientation: the left side panel (1), right side panel (2) and any center panels (3) have a notch in the bottom front corner. The side panels also have a groove in the rear to receive the back panel (4).

1. Install door mounts.

Skip this step if doors will not be installed.

- Per each compartment, lay the panels flat.
 For a left side door hinge, lay with the left surface up.
 For a right side door hinge, lay with the right surface up.
- b. See Detail 1A. Install door hinge mounts. Use a plastic mallet to pound 8-32 insert nuts (5) into the holes (three per hinge mount) located toward the front edge of each panel.
- c. See Detail 1B. Install door striker plate mounts. Turn the panels over, use a plastic mallet to pound 8-32 insert nuts (5) into the holes (two per striker plate mount) located toward the front edge of each panel.
- Install shelf clips

For fixed height shelves only, adjustable height shelf clips are pre-installed.

- See Detail 1C. Per each compartment, turn the panels so their inside surface is up.
- Push fixed height shelf clips (6) (two clips in each panel side/four per shelf) into the inside surface of both compartments (side or center panels).
- c. Turn any center panels over and repeat on the other side.

NOTICE

Panels can be large and difficult to keep aligned when attaching together with screws. To assist, "peg" the panels first by inserting wood dowels to fit snugly into 5/16" diameter holes in the panels. They may need to be tapped into place.

- 3. Insert wood dowels (8) into:
 - The left and right side edges of the top panel (9)
 - the top edge and notch of any center panels (3)
 - the backside of the bottom front stretcher panel (10).

Panel Assembly

- 1. Turn the left and right side panels (1) and (2) on edge, with the front edges down. With wood dowels (8), peg the side panels to the top panel (9).
 - Attach the side panels to the side edges of the top panel (9) with 7 x 50 mm hex socket screws (11).
- 2. Cabinets 05, 19, 24 only. See Detail 1D.

Attach one tube (17) to both the left and right side panels (1) and (2) with one 1/4-20 x 1.38" machine screw (7) on each side. The tube will slide through any center panels.

- 3. Peg any center panels (3) to the top panel (9) and attach them with 7 x 50 mm hex socket screws (11).
- 4. Attach the back panel (4).
 - a. **See Detail 1E.** The bottom stretcher panel overlaps the bottom edge of the back panel.
 - b. With the three rear stretcher panels facing up, slide the back panel into the groove on the side and top panels.
- 5. Attach the sides of the rear stretcher panels to both side panels, using 7 x 50 mm hex socket screws (11).
- 6. Turn the cabinet assembly to face the front edges up.
- Check that the cabinet assembly is square and tighten all screws.

Attach Glides and Levelers

- See Detail 1F. Tack glides help protect corners and edges while moving the cabinet into place.
 Push or hammer plastic tack glides (12) into the bottom edge of the side and any center panels, about 2" (51 mm) from the corners.
- 2. With wood dowels (8), peg the front stretcher panel (10) to the notch in the side panels and any center panels.
- Attach leveler brackets.
 - a. See Detail 1G. Attach leveler brackets (13) to the inside of all four corners of the cabinet using #8 x 5/8" pan head screws (14). The leveler brackets attach to the inside of both side panels and to the front or rear stretcher panels.
 - If there are center panels, attach only one leveler bracket to the left-front side of the right-most center panel. Attach the other side to the front stretcher panel.
 - c. After the leveler brackets are attached, screw the levelers in so the plastic glides extend slightly further than the bottom of the levelers.

Install Upper Shelves

- 1. Tip the assembled cabinet upright.
- 2. Recheck that the cabinet is square.
- 3. Recheck and tighten all hex-socket screws.
- See Detail 1H. Starting at the top of the cabinet, snap in the upper levels of shelves.

Do not install Shelves in 38" (973 mm) tall cabinets.

- For fixed height shelves (15), snap each shelf down into the shelf clips at each corner.
- b. For adjustable height shelves (16), flip the shelf pin down the in each corner at the desired shelf height and slide the shelf onto the shelf clips until the latch clicks. To remove a shelf, pull out on the latch and slide the shelf out.
 - Wider shelves may have a latch on each side.

NOTICE

To simplify leveling, do not install any lower levels of shelves yet.

Final Cabinet Adjustment


- Slide the assembled cabinet to the intended location.
- Level the cabinet using a 1/4" socket or wrench on the leveler brackets, see the "Leveling Cabinets" procedures.
- 3. Install the remaining shelves into the lower levels.

Final Cabinet Bank Assembly

- 1. Assemble, position and level any remaining cabinets.
- 2. After all cabinets in the bank have been positioned:
 - Attach the cabinet doors, see the "Attach Doors" procedures.
 - Secure the cabinets, see the "Secure Cabinets" procedures.

Assembly - Group 2 (continued)

Pre-Assembly

NOTICE

For panel orientation: The left side panel (1) and right side panel (2) have a notch in the bottom front corner. The side panels also have a groove in the rear to receive the back panel (4).

Install door mounts.

Skip this step if doors will not be installed.

- a. Per each compartment, lay the panels flat.
 For a left side door hinge, lay with the left surface up.
 For a right side door hinge, lay with the right surface up.
- See Detail 2A. Install door hinge mounts.
 Use a plastic mallet to pound 8-32 insert nuts (5) into the holes (three per hinge mount) located toward the front edge of each panel.
- c. See Detail 2B. Install door striker plate mounts. Turn the panels over, use a plastic mallet to pound 8-32 insert nuts (5) into the holes (two per striker plate mount) located toward the front edge of each panel.
- Install shelf clips.

For fixed height shelves only, adjustable height shelf clips are pre-installed.

- See Detail 2C. Per each compartment, turn the panels so their inside surface is up.
- Push fixed height shelf clips (6) into the back inside surface of both compartments.
 Bottom shelf requires two clips in each panel side/four per shelf and upper shelves require one clip in each panel side/two per shelf).

NOTICE

Panels can be large and difficult to keep aligned when attaching together with screws. To assist, "peg" the panels first by inserting wood dowels to fit snugly into 5/16" diameter holes in the panels. They may need to be tapped into place.

- 3. Insert wood dowels (8) into:
 - The left and right side edges of the top panel (9)
 - the backside of the bottom front stretcher panel (10).

Panel Assembly

- Turn the left and right side panels (1) and (2) on edge, with the front edges down. With wood dowels (8), peg the side panels to the top panel (9).
 - Attach the side panels to the side edges of the top panel (9) with 7 x 50 mm hex socket screws (11).
- 2. Attach the back panel (4).
 - a. **See Detail 2D.** The bottom stretcher panel overlaps the bottom edge of the back panel.
 - b. With the three rear stretcher panels facing up, slide the back panel into the groove on the side and top panels.
- Attach the sides of the rear stretcher panels to both side panels, using 7 x 50 mm hex socket screws (11).
- 4. Turn the cabinet assembly to face the front edges up.
- With wood dowels (8), peg the cross stretcher panel (18) to the bottom rear stretcher panel, then peg the front stretcher panel (10) to it.
- 6. With wood dowels (8), peg the front stretcher panel (10) to the notch in the side panels.

7. Cabinets 50 and 53 only. See Detail 2E.

Attach top front stretcher panel.

- Place the top front stretcher panel (19) underneath the top panel and between the side panels.
- b. Attach the sides of the top front stretcher panel to both side panels, using 7 x 50 mm hex socket screws (11).
- Check that the cabinet assembly is square and tighten all screws.

Attach Glides and Levelers

- See Detail 2F. Tack glides help protect corners and edges while moving the cabinet into place. Push or hammer plastic tack glides (12) into the bottom edge of the side and any center panels, about 2" (51 mm) from the corners.
- 2. Attach leveler brackets.
 - a. See Detail 2G. Attach leveler brackets (13) to the inside of all four corners of the cabinet using #8 x 5/8" pan head screws (14). The leveler brackets attach to the inside of both side panels and to the front or rear stretcher panels.
 - After the leveler brackets are attached, screw the levelers in so the plastic glides extend slightly further than the bottom of the levelers.

Install Upper Shelves and Hooks

- 1. Tip the assembled cabinet upright.
- 2. Recheck that the cabinet is square.
- 3. Recheck and tighten all hex-socket screws.
- See Detail 2H Starting at the top of the cabinet, snap in the upper levels of shelves.

Do not install shelves in Cabinets 50 and 53.

- a. For fixed height shelves, rest the shelf on the rear shelf clips and attach the front support tubes to the side panels using with one 1/4-20 x 1.38" machine screw (7) on each side.
- For adjustable height shelves (16), flip the shelf pin down the in each corner at the desired shelf height and slide the shelf onto the shelf clips until the latch clicks.
 To remove a shelf, pull out on the latch and slide the shelf out.

Wider shelves may have a latch on each side.

NOTICE

Cabinets 10 and 11 have two upper shelves; Cabinet 14 has only one upper shelf, in the middle.

To simplify leveling, do not install any lower levels of shelves yet.

5. Cabinets 8, 9, 30 and 45 only.

Install two brass hooks (70) to the inside surface of the left side panel (1) with the included brass screws. Use two screws per hook, pilot holes indicate the locations.

Final Cabinet Adjustment


- 1. Slide the assembled cabinet to the intended location.
- Level the cabinet using a 1/4" socket or wrench on the leveler brackets, see the "Leveling Cabinets" procedures.
- 3. Install the remaining shelves into the lower levels.

Final Cabinet Bank Assembly

- 1. Assemble, position and level any remaining cabinets.
- 2. After all cabinets in the bank have been positioned:
 - Attach the cabinet doors, see the "Attach Doors" procedures.
 - b. Secure the cabinets, see the "Secure Cabinets" procedures.

Assembly - Group 3

Cabinets 12, 15, 67, 76, 83



Assembly - Group 3 (continued)

Pre-Assembly

NOTICE

For panel orientation: the left side panel (1) and right side panel (2) have a notch in the bottom front corner. The side panels also have a groove in the rear to receive the back panel (4).

1. Install door mounts.

Skip this step if doors will not be installed.

- Per each compartment, lay the panels flat.
 For a left side door hinge, lay with the left surface up.
 For a right side door hinge, lay with the right surface up.
- b. See Detail 3A. Install door hinge mounts. Use a plastic mallet to pound 8-32 insert nuts (5) into the holes (three per hinge mount) located toward the front edge of each panel.

2. See Detail 3E (Cabinets 12, 15 and 67 only).

There are holes in each side panel that will be used later for shelf support bar screws (two per each shelf support bar end in each side panel).

Use a plastic mallet to pound 1/4-20 insert nuts (20) into these holes.

NOTICE

Panels can be large and difficult to keep aligned when attaching together with screws. To assist, "peg" the panels first by inserting wood dowels to fit snugly into 5/16" diameter holes in the panels. They may need to be tapped into place.

- 3. Insert wood dowels (8) into:
 - The left and right side edges of the top panel (9)
 - the backside of the bottom front stretcher panel (10).
 - The top of the top front stretcher panel (19).

Panel Assembly

 Turn the left and right side panels (1) and (2) on edge, with the front edges down. With wood dowels (8), peg the side panels to the top panel (9).

Attach the side panels to the side edges of the top panel (9) with 7 x 50 mm hex socket screws (11).

- 2. Attach the back panel (4).
 - a. **See Detail 3B.** The bottom stretcher panel overlaps the bottom edge of the back panel.
 - b. With the three rear stretcher panels facing up, slide the back panel into the groove on the side and top panels.
- 3. Attach the sides of the rear stretcher panels to both side panels, using 7 x 50 mm hex socket screws (11).
- 4. Turn the cabinet assembly to face the front edges up.
- 5. Fixed Height Shelf Cabinets 12, 15 and 67 only. Attach the front stretcher panel (10).
 - With wood dowels (8), peg the front stretcher panel (10) to the notch in the side panels.
 - b. Attach top front stretcher panel.
 - Place the top front stretcher panel (19) underneath the top panel and between the side panels.
 - Attach the sides of the top front stretcher panel to both side panels, using 7 x 50 mm hex socket screws (11).

Adjustable Height Shelf Cabinets 76 and 83 only. Attach the top tube (69) to both side panels using

1/4-20 x 1.77" machine screws (60).

Check that the cabinet assembly is square and tighten all screws.

Attach Glides and Levelers

 See Detail 3C. Tack glides help protect corners and edges while moving the cabinet into place.

Push or hammer plastic tack glides (12) into the bottom edge of the side and any center panels, about 2" (51 mm) from the corners.

- 2. Attach leveler brackets.
 - a. See Detail 3D. Attach leveler brackets (13) to the inside of all four corners of the cabinet using #8 x 5/8" pan head screws (14). The leveler brackets attach to the inside of both side panels and to the front or rear stretcher panels.
 - After the leveler brackets are attached, screw the levelers in so the plastic glides extend slightly further than the bottom of the levelers.

Install Upper Shelves

- Tip the assembled cabinet upright.
- 2. Recheck that the cabinet is square.
- 3. Recheck and tighten all hex-socket screws.
- See Detail 3E. If doors will be installed, attach a bumper assembly (21) To the center two holes under the front shelf support bar using 1/4-20 x 1.77" machine screws (60) and 1/4-20 hex nuts (22).
 - For Double Full-Length Doors: attach the bumper assembly the front of the bottom shelf.
 - For Double Compartment Doors: attach the bumper assembly to the front of every shelf.
- See Detail 3F

Fixed Height Shelf Cabinets 12, 15 and 67 only.

Using two 1/4-20 x 5/8" button head screws (23) on each side, attach the fixed height shelves (15) into the insert nuts installed in "Pre-Assembly Step 2".

See Detail 3G

Adjustable Height Shelf Cabinets 76 and 83 only. Starting at the top of the cabinet, flip the shelf pin dow

Starting at the top of the cabinet, flip the shelf pin down in each corner at the desired shelf height and slide the adjustable height shelves (16) onto the shelf clips until the latch clicks.

To remove a shelf, pull out on the latch and slide the shelf out. Wider shelves may have a latch on each side.

NOTICE

To simplify leveling, do not install the lower shelf yet.

Final Cabinet Adjustment


- 1. Slide the assembled cabinet to the intended location.
- Level the cabinet using a 1/4" socket or wrench on the leveler brackets, see the "Leveling Cabinets" procedures.
- 3. Install the Lower Shelf.
 - See Detail 3F. Using two 1/4-20 x 5/8" button head screws (23) on each side, attach shelf support bars (63) into the bottom screw inserts installed in "Pre-Assembly Step 2".
 - b. See Detail 3H. Peel the backing from one side of the hook and loop strips (64) and attach them to the shelf support bars (three on the front bar and two on the back bar). Do not separate the strips. Remove the remaining strip backing and place the shelf against the back panel (4) while pressing it onto the shelf supports.

Final Cabinet Bank Assembly

- 1. Assemble, position and level any remaining cabinets.
- 2. After all cabinets in the bank have been positioned:
 - a. Attach the Cabinet Doors, see the "Attach Doors" procedures.
 - b. Secure the cabinets, see the "Secure Cabinets" procedures.

Pre-Assembly

NOTICE

For panel orientation: the left side panel (1) and right side panel (2) have a notch in the bottom front corner. The side panels also have a groove in the rear to receive the back panel (4).

1. Install door mounts.

Skip this step if doors will not be installed.

- Per each compartment, lay the panels flat.
 For a left side door hinge, lay with the left surface up.
 For a right side door hinge, lay with the right surface up.
- b. See Detail 4A. Install door hinge mounts. Use a plastic mallet to pound 8-32 insert nuts (5) into the holes (three per hinge mount) located toward the front edge of each panel.
- See Detail 4B. Install door striker plate mounts.
 Turn the panels over, use a plastic mallet to pound 8-32 insert nuts (5) into the holes (two per striker plate mount) located toward the front edge of each panel.
- Install shelf clips.

For fixed height shelves only, adjustable height shelf clips are pre-installed.

- See Detail 4C. Per each compartment, turn the panels so their inside surface is up.
- b. Push fixed height shelf clips (6) into the back inside surface of both compartments. Bottom shelf requires two clips in each panel side/four per shelf and upper shelves require one clip in each panel side/two per shelf).

NOTICE

Panels can be large and difficult to keep aligned when attaching together with screws. To assist, "peg" the panels first by inserting wood dowels to fit snugly into 5/16" diameter holes in the panels. They may need to be tapped into place.

- 3. Insert wood dowels (8) into:
 - The left and right side edges of the top panel (9)
 - the backside of the bottom front stretcher panel (10).

- With wood dowels (8), peg the front stretcher panel (10) to the notch in the side panels.
- Check that the cabinet assembly is square and tighten all screws.

Attach Glides and Levelers

- See Detail 4E. Tack glides help protect corners and edges while moving the cabinet into place.
 Push or hammer plastic tack glides (12) into the bottom edge of the side and any center panels, about 2" (51 mm) from the corners.
- 2. Attach leveler brackets.
 - a. See Detail 4F. Attach leveler brackets (13) to the inside of all four corners of the cabinet using #8 x 5/8" pan head screws (14). The leveler brackets attach to the inside of both side panels and to the front or rear stretcher panels.
 - b. After the leveler brackets are attached, screw the levelers in so the plastic glides extend slightly further than the bottom of the levelers.

Install Upper Shelves

- 1. Tip the assembled cabinet upright.
- Recheck that the cabinet is square.
- 3. Recheck and tighten all hex-socket screws.
- 4. See Detail 4G. If the cabinet has a hanger bar (15).



For easiest installation, start with the lowest doors and work upward.

To attach the doors:

1. Install door hinges.

For wood doors (35) only (separate procedure for grille door).

- a. See Detail A. Install door hinge mounts.
 - In the front face of both doors, use a plastic mallet to pound 8-32 insert nuts (5) into the four sets of holes (two per hinge) located toward the rear edge.
- b. Attach four hinges (36) to the inside (back face) of both wood doors using 3/4" flat head screws (30) into each set of installed insert nuts.
- 2. Attach doors to both sides of each compartment.
 - a. **See Detail B.** Hold the left side door in position on the cabinet.
 - Attach each hinge to the side panel using 3/4" flat head screws (30) into each set of installed insert nuts.
 - To help hold the door in place, insert the first screw into the rear-most hole in the side panel. Place the slotted hole of the hinge onto the screw and rotate it to align the other two holes.
 - Tighten all three screws.
 - b. Repeat for the right side door.
 - c. **For wood doors (35) only.** Secure each hinge to the back edge of the door using one #7 x 5/8 flat head screw (37).
- 3. Attach lock housings.

For wood doors (35) only (separate procedure for grille door)

- a. See Detail C. Insert the card holder housing (46) posts into the two holes in the front face of both doors.
- b. Insert 10-24 hex cap nuts (39) into the holes from the back face of the doors and tighten them onto the lock housing posts.
- c. Snap a card holder (40) onto both lock housings.
- 4. Attach door handles.

For wood doors (35) only (grille doors do not have handles)

- a. See Detail D. Insert the door handle (44) posts into the two holes in the front face of both doors.
- b. Insert 10-24 hex cap nuts (39) into the holes from the back face of the doors and tighten them onto the door handle posts.
- c. Closing the doors aligns holes in the handles for installing a padlock.
- 5. Attach door catches.
 - a. **See Detail E.** Attach door catches (45) to the underside of the top panel at the handle side of the door using two #8 x 5/8" pan head screws (14).
- 6. Cabinet leveling may require slight adjustment to ensure proper door fit.







To attach the sound absorptive material to the back of the AcoustiCabinets:

- See Detail A. Flip-Stix® (47) are used to hold the sound absorptive material in place.
 The Flip-Stix are already attached to the rear stretcher panels on the back of all AcoustiCabinets.
 The quantity of Flip-Stix installed on the cabinet will vary by cabinet design.
 On each Flip-Stix, pull the top tab out approximately 1-1/2" (38 mm).
- 2. Unroll and "fluff-up" the sound absorptive material.
- 3. See Detail B. Attach the sound absorptive material (48) to the back of the cabinet by placing it over all of the Flip-Stix approximately 2" (51 mm) above the desired final location with the opening in the plastic barrier facing toward the top of the cabinet.
- 4. Pull down on the sound absorptive material to secure it into place on the Flip-Stix and pulling it level. The Flip-Stix are intended to penetrate the inside plastic and the insulation only, not the outside plastic barrier.






Detail A2 - Top View of Wall Mounted Cabinets Flush Back









5. Using the 3/16" drill bit, drill twelve holes (nine holes for 68" [1727 mm] tall cabinets) into the side panel of the cabinet to be covered.

NOTICE

Do not drill into a shelf or cross member. Measure before drilling so that the hole is 1-2" (25-51 mm) from the nearest horizontal surface to allow clearance for tools.

Top Row

Drill a hole 2-3" (51-76 mm) down from the top and 2-3" (51-76 mm) back from the front of the cabinet.

Drill the second hole 2-3" (51-76 mm) down from the top and 24-26" (610-660 mm) (14-16" [336-406 mm] for 19-1/4" [489 mm] deep cabinets) from the front of the cabinet.

Drill a third hole 2-3" down from the top and evenly spaced horizontally between the first two holes.

Bottom Row

Drill a hole 7-8" (178-203 mm) up from the bottom and 2-3" (51-76 mm) back from the front of the cabinet.

Drill the second hole 7-8" (178-203 mm) up from the bottom and 24-26" (610-660 mm) (14-16" [336-406 mm] for 19-1/4" [489 mm] deep cabinets) from the front of the cabinet.

Drill a third hole 7-8" (178-203 mm) up from the bottom and evenly spaced horizontally between the first two holes.

Middle Rows

Drill two rows (1 row for 68" [1727 mm] tall cabinets) evenly spaced between the top and bottom rows. Use the same vertical spacing as the top and bottom rows.

6. Raise the cover panel into position covering the cabinet side panel and flush with the front edge as in step 3.


7. Clamp securely in position using at least two *non-marring padded clamps*.

8. Insert all twelve of the supplied #8 1-3/8" wood screws (54) (nine are used on 68" [1727 mm] cabinets).

Do not over-torque or strip out the screws.

Tighten securely and remove the clamps.

9. Insert 1/4-20 insert nuts (20) into the open holes at the inside front edge of the cabinet side panel.

Center Cover Panels




Use the following steps ONLY when a smaller cabinet is adjacent to a larger cabinet with a cover panel in place on the larger cabinet.

- 1. Install the cover panel using the procedures in "End Cover Panels".
- 2. Align both cabinets to the desired configuration. If the cabinets are different depths, they may be aligned to be flush with the front as shown or flush with the back.

NOTICE

Do not drill into a shelf or cross member. Measure before drilling so that the hole is 1-2" (25-51 mm) from the nearest horizontal surface to allow clearance for tools. It may be necessary to move a hole and drill completely through the smaller cabinet side panel, cover panel and larger cabinet side panel simultaneously.

- 3. Drill two connecting holes through the cover panel and attached cabinet side panel (drill three holes if the cabinets are both over 68" [1227 mm] tall) using the 3/8" drill bit through the holes already in the smaller cabinet.
- 4. If there is not enough room in the compartment for a drill, it may be necessary to mark the holes using a pencil through the connecting holes in the smaller cabinet side panel, move the smaller cabinet, drill the holes through the cover panel and larger cabinet side panel, re-position the smaller cabinet and connect them all together.
- 4. Connect the cabinets together using 1/4-20 x 2.359" machine screws (55).
- Plug the hole at the other end with the plugs (56) that were included with the cabinet.
- 6. Use of trim strips (49) between the smaller cabinet and the cover panel is required (trim strips are included with cabinet).

Before You Begin

Read and understand this procedure before starting the assembly. Remove all items from the shipping carton. Each kit contains:

- One 8' x 4' (2438 x 1219 mm) closure panel (62)
- Two 2" x 4" x 8' (51 x 102 x 2438 mm) metal studs (61)
- Three 8' (2438 mm) PVC extrusion strips (67) (to cover variations in the perimeter of the space being closed off)
- Screws
 - #8 x 1-1/4" truss head screws (67) (to attach wood panels)
 - #8 x 5/8" pan head screws (14) (to attach metal studs)




Planning the Installation


- 1. Be sure the cabinet(s) are in their desired location and are level and square before installing the closure panels.
- 2. A closure panel kit includes a panel which is 8' long x 4' (2438 x 1219 mm) wide. For smaller spaces, the panel will be cut to size.


 Wenger Corporation does not recommend using the closure panels to fill spaces larger than 32" (813 mm) wide except in the situations shown in these instructions.
- 3. If one side panel abuts a wall, appropriate fasteners will need to be purchased to attach the metal studs to the structure.
- 4. Closure panels alongside cabinets should be installed set back 2" (51 mm) from the front of the cabinet (flush with the face of the toe-kick area). Soffit panels should likewise be set back 2" (51 mm) from the front of the cabinet.
 - The top edge of all vertical closure panels should be installed flush with the top of the cabinet.
- 5. The illustrations on the following pages show the normal locations where the 3/4" x 8' (19 x 2438 mm) pvc extrusion strips are used. However, they can be installed on any edge of the closure panel(s) where desirable for a more finished appearance.
- 6. The assembly procedure shows a typical installation of a vertical closure panel between a cabinet and the wall. The procedure for other situations is similar. Refer to the appropriate illustration and follow the step-by-step procedure.




Closure Panel Configurations


Closure Panel Assembly

 - a. Attach one stud to the cabinet using five #8 x 5/8" pan head screws (14).
 - b. Attach the other stud to the adjacent structure or cabinet using the appropriate fastener and follow the manufacturer's instructions. See "Cabinet Fastener Guidelines" for more information.



6. See Detail B. Slip the extrusion strips to fit onto the edge(s) of the closure panel.

7. See Detail C. Attach the closure panel to the metal studs using six #8 x 1-1/4" truss head screws (67). Loosely tighten the screws. Push the extrusions out against the cabinet or structure, then finish tightening the screws to hold the extrusions in place.

Work Surface Tops (Cabinets 50-62 Only)

Wall Mount Installation

- 1. Align the work surface on the top of the cabinet with 1/2" (13 mm) overhang to the front and 1" (25 mm) to the side where appropriate.
 - Position the rounded corner facing traffic areas or as shown on the installation drawings.
 - Attach from the underside using #8 x 1.5" wood screws (57) through the pilot holes in the cabinet tops.
- 2. For Cabinet 62, insert the drawers into drawer glides.

Island Installation


- 1. **See Detail A.** Align the work surface on the top of the cabinets with 1/2" (13 mm) overhang to the front and 1" (25 mm) to the side where appropriate. For single row cabinet islands, align for 1/2" to 1" overhang on the backside.
 - Position the rounded corners to traffic areas or as shown on the installation drawings. Attach from the underside using #8 x 1.5" wood screws (57) through the pilot holes in the cabinet tops
- 2. For a single row island installation attach the cabinet connector bracket (58) to the back of the cabinet and to the underside of the work surface using #8 x 5/8" flat head sheet metal screws (59). Place finished back panel over bracket.
- 3. For double row cabinet island installation attach the cabinet connector bracket (58) using #8 x 5/8" flat head sheet metal screws (59) to the sides of the two outer cabinets on both ends of the island and to the underside of the work surface. Place finished end cover panel over bracket.



38" (973 mm) cabinets with work surface tops have a maximum load capacity of 250 lb (113 kg) for evenly distributed loads.

All other cabinets have a top maximum load capacity of 50 lb (23 kg).





Cabinet Maintenance

Cleaning

For removal of mild stains and mild scuff marks, the polyester wood panels and polyester shelves may be cleaned using an all-purpose household cleaner, or just simple mild soap and water.

For heavier scuff marks, ink stains, felt pen and magic marker stains, or other tough stains; use a non-abrasive cleaner, or an industrial all-purpose cleaner. Ammoniated or vinegar-based glass cleaners also work well for these stains.

Do not use harsh abrasive cleaners, as permanent damage could occur to the panel surface. Be sure to quickly remove all cleanser residues with water and wipe dry with a soft cloth.

Humidity Control

To insure longevity of panel performance, maintain the relative humidity between 25% - 55% at the permanent installation site.
