


Assembly Instructions Tall Folio Cabinets

INTENDED USE

- This product is intended for indoor use in normal ambient temperature and humidity conditions it must not be exposed to prolonged outside weather conditions.
- This product is intended to be assembled and used only as described in these instructions.

WARRANTY

These products are guaranteed free of defects in materials and workmanship for five full years from date of shipment. A full warranty statement is available upon request.

BEFORE YOU BEGIN

- The Tall Folio Cabinet is shipped almost entirely assembled.
- To install, level the unit and attach the few remaining components as outlined in these instructions.
- Read the complete assembly procedure before you begin.
- Remove all items from the shipping carton, and lay them out approximately in their final position.

REQUIRED TOOLS

The following tools must be available to assemble the Tall Folio Cabinets:

- · Carpenter's Level
- Carpenter's Square

- Variable Speed Drill (to drive hex socket screws)
- 4mm Hex Drive for Drill.


Plastic Mallet

LEVELING THE CABINET


NOTE: Do Not try to level the cabinet to match soffits.

Do Not try to plumb the cabinet to match adjacent walls. Do Not install door handles until cabinets have been leveled.For proper door alignment, follow these instructions carefully. See "Changing Shelf Locations" for removal of file drawers prior to leveling cabinet.

 Check the level of the entire floor where the cabinets will be installed. Determine the highest point of the floor in that area. Extend all levelers until the bottom of the cabinet will be higher than the highest point in the floor.




2. Adjust the levelers on one side until the front edges of the cabinet side panels are plumb (side-to-side).




LEVELING THE CABINET (CONTINUED)

- 3. Measure A and B with a tape and adjust the front levelers until A=B (+ 1/32 inch).

- 4. Adjust both front levelers equally until the front edges of the cabinet are plumb (front-to-back).



 Recheck that A=B and that the door is even with the top panel. Readjust if necessary (steps 2 - 4). Insert hole plugs into the two holes that are in the bottom shelf for leveling the cabinet.




SECURING THE CABINET(S) TO THE WALL

There are L-shaped brackets in the hardware bag for attaching the cabinets to your wall surface. Because of the variety of possible wall surfaces, fasteners are not included. Have your maintenance people recommend an appropriate type for safe, secure attachment.

NOTE: Make sure all the cabinets are secured together before you attach them to the back wall.

- Using the L-shaped brackets, you can tie cabinets together and to the wall surface at the top. The brackets have extra holes: if the cabinets can't be positioned tight against the wall, you can slide the bracket back as much as 2" until it is tight against the wall surface.
- 2. Use the necessary fasteners suggested by your maintenance people to secure the cabinets to the wall.



A CAUTION

Cabinets must be properly secured to the back wall and are unsafe if not properly secured as specified. **A** CAUTION


Use methods appropriate to your wall surfaces.

Do not walk or load anything on top of Folio Cabinets.

NUMBERING SYSTEM

 To assign numbers to individual slots, use enclosed number strips or blank strips. They can be added or removed in the black extrusions as your numbering system changes. Refer to Step 1 under "Changing Shelf Locations" to remove extrusions. Letters or numbers can be written on the strips using ink pen, marking pen or permanent markers and can be easily erased with all purpose cleaner (or industrial cleaner for dry erase markers) or slide the pre-printed enclosed number strip into the slot as shown.

Note: At the top of each number strip, the shelf spacing is identified.



CHANGING SHELF LOCATIONS

A Philips Head Screwdriver is required to change the shelf locations.

 Wenger Mobile Folio Cabinets are shipped with the shelves already installed. They are held in place by an aluminum extrusion which runs from top to bottom of each compartment.

To change shelf locations, follow these instructions to remove as many of the stops as necessary. After moving the shelves, reinstall the extrusions.

2. To remove the extrusions in the middle of the cabinet, remove the two screws at the top of each extrusion, pull the top of the extrusion forward, and lift the extrusion along with the plastic bracket out of the lower bracket.

Reposition shelves in the appropriate slots prior to replacing the extrusions.
